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




- We believe that the whole of life and creation is sacred.

CHARACTERISTICS OF PIONEER CHURCHES:


Although diverse, Pioneer churches share the following 'apostolic' distinctives:

- THEY PRIORITISE THE PRESENCE OF GOD
- THEY ARE MISSION FOCUSED
- THEY ARE RELATIONAL
- THEIR LEADERSHIP IS EXPRESSED IN TEAM
- THEY BELIEVE THAT EVERY MEMBER HAS A PART TO PLAY
- THEY ARE CATALYSTS FOR UNITY
- THEY MODEL A CULTURE OF HOSPITALITY
 AND GENEROSITY

OUR REGIONAL STRATEGY

Our strategy is to develop strong resource churches within each of our Pioneer regions. These resource churches seek to serve the other Pioneer churches in their region as they, in turn, serve their communities, towns and cities.

The Regional Leader(s) will be based in a resource church and will often lead the church or be part of its leadership team. The Regional Leaders play a key role in connecting the Pioneer churches within their region and offering strategic leadership support where needed. They also host regular leadership days and other regional events. In some cases, especially in our larger regions, the Regional Leader works with a Regional Leadership Team.



CURRENT PIONEER REGIONS

Pioneer UK is currently structured into five regions:

- Pioneer North led by Richard & Judith Anniss
- Pioneer Midlands led by Ness Wilson
- Pioneer East led by Graham Blake
- Pioneer London led by Linda Ward
- Pioneer South led by Paul & Paula Weston

Most churches belong to the geographical region in which they are located. There are a few exceptions where churches choose to connect into another region out of a relational connection. We run several key national events:

- FEBRUARY / MARCH
 ANNUAL LEADERS CONFERENCE
- APRIL
 WOMEN LEADERS CONFERENCE
- MAY AND NOVEMBER
 PIONEER CORE TRAINING MODULES
- SEPTEMBER (Biannually)
 SENIOR LEADERS RETREAT

When a church is exploring a relationship with Pioneer, you'll be offered complimentary tickets to attend a forthcoming national event.

Once a church joins, it is important that the key leaders attend the Annual Leaders Conferences and the four Pioneer CORE training modules which take place over two days every six months and explore our four network values in-depth, both theologically and in practical outworking.



COMMUNICATION

We produce a monthly Pioneer newsletter and video from the National Leadership Team - the video can help your church members feel a stronger connection to Pioneer.

JOINING PIONEER -

THE JOURNEY

There are a series of steps in the process of discernment to see if Pioneer is the right fit for you. These will be done relationally and at an appropriate pace.

THE PROCESS WILL LOOK SOMETHING LIKE THIS:

(Although not necessarily in this order)



You'll receive an introductory letter outlining the process and inviting you to add your contact details to our database.

You'll meet with the Regional Leader to tell them more about the story of your church, talk through this booklet and discuss what it means to join Pioneer. The Regional Leader will arrange a number of meetings with you and your team to talk through the core values and distinctives of Pioneer to ensure that we are a good fit for your church.





You'll be invited to attend both a regional and a national network event to give you a fuller experience of Pioneer. You will receive complimentary tickets to your first event.

The Regional Leader or an appointed member of the Regional Team will come and speak at a church gathering to allow the congregation to meet a Pioneer representative.

There will be a second meeting with your leadership team. At this point we would ask for an honest assessment of any risks or challenges that your church is currently facing. Examples would include financial issues, imminent leadership transition, significant divisions in the church, etc. This simply allows us to ensure you get the specific support you need.



Pioneer holds a theologically orthodox position.
As such, you'll be asked to affirm your church's commitment to the Nicene Creed and the Evangelical Alliance Statement of Faith. Printed copies will be provided for you to sign.





We'll ask you to work through our Governance Checklist and our Safeguarding Checklist. These will help you to review your current practices and, where necessary, to strengthen your church's organisational health. You'll be asked to share the completed checklists with your Regional Leader, as well as with our Network Safeguarding Advisor. We also have a partnership with Stewardship who provide advice and various resources regarding governance and finance.

At this point, we would expect it to be obvious to you and us if Pioneer is the right fit for you. If so, you'll get a welcome letter receiving you into the Network, signed by both you and us.





Next, the Regional Leader will visit your church again and personally welcome your church congregation into Pioneer.

Your key leaders will be asked to attend the Annual Leaders Conference, where you will be officially welcomed into Pioneer by the whole network.



WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF BEING A PIONEER CHURCH?

Belonging to a supportive family of churches sharing common vision, values and distinctives. Taking inspiration from others advancing the Kingdom in different ways; providing each other with ideas and momentum. Playing your part in shaping Pioneer's future, as you contribute your strengths, gifts and experience to build the network. Getting support and encouragement from your Regional leader and team. This is particularly important in times of leadership transition or complicated situations where objective, wise external help is invaluable. Accessing inspiring events and excellent training eg. affordable leadership training called Pioneer Pathway and free safeguarding training. Enabling key people and ministries in your church to meet up with others in similar roles and ministries across the network eg. Pioneer youth leaders, worship leaders, children and families workers, evangelists and Pioneer RISE (leaders in their 20s & 30s) Adding an additional layer of accountability for your leadership team, providing reassurance for your members. You can use our logo and branding to gain the added credibility of being part of a national network. Pioneer is a recognised network within Churches Together in England (which can even help with getting



children into Church of England schools).

WHAT DO WE EXPECT IN RETURN?

There are a few things we ask of you to enable the network to flourish:

A commitment to the vision and values of Pioneer, including speaking highly of the network and working with us relationally on any potential difficulties in theology or practice. Regular attendance at both national and regional events. In particular, we ask that your key leaders complete all four Pioneer CORE training modules (two days every six months) and make the Annual Leadership Conference a priority each year. That you connect and build relationships with your Pioneer Regional Leader and other churches in your region. That you invite your Regional Leader (or an agreed member of the Regional Team) to provide oversight and accountability for your church. This might look like providing pastoral support for key leaders, an informal annual review with the senior leader(s), mediating in any team conflict, signposting relevant resources, offering advice on strategic decisions, involvement in leadership transition and commissioning new leaders. Compliance with GDPR, Governance and Safeguarding policies. A regular financial contribution to the work of Pioneer. We ask all churches to contribute at least 3% of their donated income. In addition, we also take up occasional special offerings, such as at our Annual Leaders Conference.



NEXT STEPS

If you think you would like to continue this process of joining Pioneer, please get back in touch with your Regional Leader who will guide you through the next steps.

We look forward to getting to know you better and, if we all discern that joining is right for you, we look forward to welcoming your church into the Pioneer family!
